Frank P. Weber, a member of the Senior Executive Service is the executive director of the Headquarters Standard Systems Group, Maxwell Air Force Base, Gunter Annex, Ala. He directs an organization comprised of more than 2,500 military, civil service and contract support people with an annual budget exceeding \$450 million. The Standard Systems Group designs, builds or buys, then installs and maintains the combat support information systems for the Air Force and Department of Defense. The group acquires quality information technology products used by virtually every organization on bases worldwide. It is a direct reporting unit of the Electronic Systems Center, Air Force Materiel Command, Hanscom Air Force Base, Mass.

Weber entered federal civil service in 1975 as a transportation management career intern with Headquarters Military Traffic Management Command. At MTMC he served in various assignments culminating as command analyst for the Department of Defense and Army deployment programs. In 1983 he served briefly as a strategic mobility planner in the Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Logistics, Headquarters Department of the Army. He then began serving in various positions within the Mobilization Division, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations and Plans, Headquarters, Department of the Army. From 1990 to 1992 he served as chief of the Mobilization Division with oversight responsibility for the development and implementation of Army mobilization policy and guidance. Weber was appointed to the Senior Executive Service in February 1992 and assigned to the U.S. Transportation Command as deputy director for plans and policy.
