Colonel Victor G. Jevsevar, Jr. is the vice director and military commander of the Headquarters Standard Systems Group, Maxwell Air Force Base, Gunter Annex, Ala. He advises and assists the executive director in every facet of the day-to-day leadership of SSG and provides continuing oversight and support for more than 130 fielded computer systems. Colonel Jevsevar directs more than 2,000 military and civilian personnel and oversees 700-plus contractors.
